These discussions have helped to build a sense of belonging and appreciation for diversity within our classroom community.

NURSERY THIS TERM

This half term, our Nursery children set off on an exciting outdoor adventure inspired by the story "We're Going on a Leaf Hunt" by Steve Metzger. Just like the characters in the book, the children explored the outdoors with curiosity and joy, searching high and low for colourful autumn leaves. Along the way, they noticed the changing seasons, talked about different leaf shapes and colours, and collected their favourite finds to bring back to nursery.

This hands-on activity sparked curiosity and provided a wealth of learning opportunities. Together, we explored the life cycle of a leaf, sorted and categorised the leaves by colour and shape, and even practised early counting skills using the leaves they had gathered.

It was a wonderful opportunity to connect with nature, build new vocabulary, and spark imaginative play — all while celebrating the magic of autumn!



















The Reception children have made a fantastic start to their school journey this half term. They have been actively settling into their new environment, gradually becoming more confident with class routines and expectations. Through daily interactions, both structured and informal, the children have been building positive relationships with their peers and teachers, laying the foundations for a supportive and happy classroom community.

An important focus this term has been on early pre-writing skills. The children have been exploring these through engaging music and movement activities, helping them to develop coordination, rhythm, and control, which are all essential stepping stones towards writing. Alongside this, we have been encouraging self-expression and celebrating individuality, giving the children opportunities to talk about themselves and what makes each of them unique. These discussions have naturally led into learning about the value of friendship, kindness, and the different ways in which we can support one another, both in school and in the wider community.

This half-term has also marked the exciting beginning of our Phonics journey. The children have shown great enthusiasm as they begin to recognise sounds and blend them to form words. We were especially delighted to welcome many Reception parents into school to observe reading lessons. These sessions provided valuable opportunities for parents to see our teaching approach in action and to learn practical ways to support their children at home with early reading.

We are incredibly proud of how well the children have adapted and the progress they have already made. Their curiosity, energy, and eagerness to learn have made this half-term both exciting and rewarding for everyone involved. We are looking forward to building on this strong start as we move into the next half-term, with plenty more learning adventures to come!

















This half-term, the Reception children have been exploring the colourful and creative world of Pablo Picasso. After looking closely at some of his famous portraits, the children discussed what made them special—unusual shapes, bold colours, and features placed in surprising ways.

Inspired by Picasso's abstract style, the children then created their own imaginative portraits. With paint, collage, and lots of creativity, they experimented with mixing shapes, patterns, and colours to show faces in fun and unexpected ways.

The activity encouraged the children to think about art in a new light, celebrating that portraits don't always have to look "real" to be meaningful. It was wonderful to see them express their individuality and imagination so confidently, producing vibrant works of art that reflected their own personalities.







Reception were delighted to take part in a special dental workshop this half-term, led by Sally McGregor. Sally spoke to the children about the importance of looking after their teeth, explaining how healthy eating and daily brushing help to keep smiles bright and strong.

The children had the chance to practise brushing their teeth carefully, learning the correct techniques and understanding why it's important to do it twice a day. They were enthusiastic participants, asking thoughtful questions and proudly showing how well they could brush.

This hands-on session gave the children practical skills and confidence, while reinforcing the message that taking care of our teeth is an important part of keeping our whole body healthy. We are very grateful to Sally for making the workshop so engaging and fun!









This half-term, the Reception children enjoyed a very special baking experience inspired by the story of The Little Red Hen. After learning about the importance of teamwork and helping others through the tale, the children had the chance to put those lessons into practice by baking their own delicious buns.

We were fortunate to be joined by Ayman and Abdelhadi's dad, a professional baker, who kindly guided the children through the process step by step. The children measured, mixed, kneaded, and shaped the dough with great enthusiasm, eagerly watching their creations come to life. A big thank you also goes to Mu, who was a wonderful assistant throughout the session, helping the children stay organised and engaged.

The baking session was not only fun and memorable, but it also gave the children a hands-on opportunity to develop their fine motor skills, follow instructions carefully, and work collaboratively. Most importantly, it brought to life the key message of The Little Red Hen—that by working together, everyone can enjoy the rewards. The highlight, of course, was sitting down together to taste the freshly baked buns they had helped to make!





















Reception enjoyed a wonderful seasonal adventure with a visit to Sipson Meadows for an autumn walk. The children set off to explore the natural world around them, looking carefully for signs of autumn. Along the way, they collected treasures such as acorns, shiny conkers, and colourful fallen leaves.

The walk gave the children the chance to use their senses—listening to the crunch of leaves underfoot, spotting the changing colours in the trees, and feeling the textures of the objects they gathered. Back in class, the collected items became a starting point for discussions, creative activities, and displays that celebrated the beauty of the season.

It was a joyful way to connect classroom learning with the outdoors, encouraging curiosity, observation skills, and a deeper appreciation of nature.

This half term, our Reception children have been learning all about People Who Help Us — both in school and in the wider community. Around school, the children met some of our everyday heroes, including the caretaker, cook, cleaner, and office staff, and discovered how each person helps to keep our school safe, clean, and running smoothly.

The children also had the pleasure of meeting visitors from the wider community, such as an airport security officer, baker, dental nurse, and took part in exciting hands-on workshops to learn more about their important roles. These experiences have helped the children develop a deeper understanding of how different people help us every day, while inspiring kindness, curiosity, and gratitude.



























YEAR 1 THIS TERM

This half term, Year 1 have been working exceptionally hard, showing great resilience and curiosity across all subjects of the curriculum. In Maths, the children have been using a variety of manipulatives to grasp new concepts and collaborating to solve questions on number and place value, including comparing numbers using 'greater than', 'less than' and 'equal to'.

In Reading we have continued with our daily phonics lessons which are tailored to the children's individual phonics stages. This tailored support has enabled fantastic progress for our children and has developed their knowledge of their phonics set sounds. As a class we have enjoyed reading stories together, a particular favourite has been "The Gigantic Turnip", where we have discovered the enormous impact even the smallest creatures can have.

In Writing, the children have been working hard on sentence structure including the use of capital letters, full stops and finger spaces, and have focused on some key features of Year 1 writing including adjectives, conjunctions (because, but, and) and exclamation marks. Our focus texts have included character description, diary entries and fact files based on the animals from the book 'Animal Tales from India: Ten stories from the Panchatantra' by Nikita Gill.

In Science, the children are developing their skills in conducting experiments, recording results and sharing their findings. They have enjoyed investigating different materials and their properties, testing their suitability for tasks such as determining which materials would be best for making an umbrella and helping NASA to experiment with different types of rocket!

A major success this term in Year 1 has also been the development of continuous provision through our curriculum play projects. This has enabled the children to learn through play using four areas within the classroom:

Build: Where the children are able to explore learning through the use of building resources including Lego, blocks, construction toys and magnetic tiles.

Make and create: Where the children have access to a range of junk modelling materials to create models to accompany their learning. In this area we have also introduced woodworking stations which the children have thoroughly enjoyed.

Message: Where the children are able to practise communicating their learning through writing messages, instructions, lists and codes using a range of writing implements.

Draw: Where children have access to a range of materials to illustrate their learning through pictures, sketches and labelled diagrams.

Through this approach, not only are the children able to learn through play, but they are also able to refine their motor skills, develop their communication skills and explore problem solving, as well as embodying the five guiding powers of resilience, curiosity, aspiration, collaboration and respect.

As their teachers, we are incredibly proud of all their achievements and look forward to celebrating even more successes as the year progresses. Well done, Year 1!

YEAR 2 THIS TERM

We have started Year 2 with such great enthusiasm and curiosity around the curriculum. So far we have written about the story "Florence Nightingale" We have looked at place value, materials and learning all about nurses.

In Reading and Writing we have been looking at Florence Nightingale and learning about what she did in her lifetime. We have been writing about what Florence did in her life and how she helped others as well as her legacy.

In Maths, we have looked at place value and now we are working on addition and subtraction with numbers all the way to 100. We are also working on using number bonds to help us add and subtract.

In Science, we have been looking at materials and what the properties of different materials are. We looked at what makes a material waterproof and the words absorbent and non absorbent to describe the different materials. As a year group we tested different materials to see if they were absorbent or non absorbent, we were very surprised by our findings.

We also had the opportunity to visit Tower Bridge as part of our Science topic, where we looked at the different materials used to make the bridge. We had the opportunity to learn about the history behind the bridge and a true story about a bus driver called Albert. He drove the 78 bus and jumped over the bridge. We then created our own stop motion movies to retell the story of Albert's jumping bus. Then we had the chance to explore the bridge and learn about the materials used to build it. We learnt about how old the bridge was and all the different jobs people had in order to open and close the bridge. Did you know it took 8 years to build Tower Bridge? We even walked across the glass floor. It was such a fantastic trip and we had so much fun!!

In History, we have been looking at the History of nursing. We looked at the NHS and what life was life before the NHS. We then looked at Florence Nightingale and Mary Seacole who were both nurses. We compared their lives and how they made an impact on the world. As our end of unit write up we wrote a comparison about the 2 nurses and who we felt was more significant in History.

In Music, we have started by using instruments. We have been learning to play the Djembe. We have been learning the different hits you can play on a Djembe. We have a bass hit, tone hit and a slap hit. We have also been practicing playing along to a song changing the type of hit we use. Now we are looking at different volumes when playing the Djembe ask your child if they can remember the names of them. The children have really enjoyed it so far and look forward to music each week!

In Art, we have been learning about Paul Cezanne and his paintings focusing on still life. We have been practicing our skills of sketching apples/fruit using different techniques. We also took some time to mix colours and see which different colours we can make and recapped the primary colours. Then we had the opportunity to go to the art room and practice our final piece before completing it on a canvas. Please do come and join us for the Art Exhibition after half term to see our wonderful creations.

On Monday 6th and Tuesday 7th October, Year 2 went to visit Tower Bridge. We got on the bus and train to get there which was so exciting. We had the opportunity to learn about the history behind the bridge and a true story about a bus driver called Albert. He drove the 78 bus and jumped over the bridge. We then created our own stop motion movies to retell the story of Albert's jumping bus. Then we had the chance to explore the bridge and learn about the materials used to build it. YEAR 3 THIS TERM

We have had a wonderful start to Year 3, filled with curiosity, creativity, and enthusiasm for learning across all our subjects. In Reading and Writing, we have been exploring The Stolen Spear, a fascinating story that has helped us imagine what life might have been like in prehistoric times. We have been developing our narrative writing skills by describing characters, settings, and emotions, and have even tried writing from different points of view.

In Maths, we've been getting to grips with hundreds and place value, learning how to represent, partition, and compare numbers. The children have enjoyed using practical equipment and visual models to strengthen their understanding and build confidence with larger numbers.

Our Science lessons have focused on Light and Shadows. We have investigated how shadows are formed, how their shapes and sizes change, and how light travels. The children have loved conducting experiments and making predictions before testing their ideas.

In History, we have been journeying through time—studying the Stone Age, Bronze Age, and Iron Age and discovering how human life, tools, and communities changed over thousands of years. This learning has linked beautifully with our Art topic, where we created our own Bell Beaker pots, carefully shaping and decorating them with patterns inspired by ancient designs.

The highlight of our term was our visit to Stonehenge, where we were able to see first-hand one of the most iconic monuments from prehistory. It was a truly memorable experience that brought our learning to life and sparked many thoughtful discussions back in the classroom. Year 3 have shown great enthusiasm and teamwork this term, and we can't wait to see what they'll discover next!

















YEAR 4 THIS TERM

This half term has been a busy one for Year 4! In maths, we've been learning about place value as well as addition and subtraction—it's been a blast! In writing, we've focused on crafting setting descriptions and dialogue pieces, developing our creativity and storytelling skills.

During art, we've taken inspiration from Gwen John, one of Wales's finest painters, known for her expressive drawing techniques. We have been practising our drawing and shading skills, and experimenting with charcoal and pastels to recreate her famous cat painting.

In geography, we have been learning about sustainability and exploring whether our local community contributes to it. We were lucky enough to go on a field trip to investigate energy consumption in our area. During our visit, we collected data on the energy used by different forms of transportation and plotted our findings on a bar chart to analyse the results. Afterwards, we discussed a range of ideas on how we could help make our community more sustainable!

In PSHE, we have been learning about feelings and how people might react in different situations. We played a variety of games to help us recognise and guess different emotions, and took part in group discussions about positive and negative ways to manage our feelings.

In RE, we have been learning about Hinduism and even had the amazing opportunity to visit a Mandir! During our visit, we asked lots of thoughtful questions to deepen our understanding and saw some beautiful statues up close. We also had the chance to observe members of the community as they prayed, which really helped bring our learning to life.

It's been a fantastic half term full of learning, creativity, and new experiences—we can't wait to see what next term brings!

YEAR 5 THIS TERM

What a wonderful first term it has been in Year 5! The children have made an excellent start to the year, showing great enthusiasm, teamwork, and curiosity in everything they do. They have taken on new challenges with confidence and shown just how ready they are for the exciting learning adventures in Year 5 at William Byrd.

In our reading and writing lessons, we have been diving into the thrilling story of Dragon Mountain. The children have loved following the adventures of Billy and Dylan as they uncover a world filled with dragons, mystery, and courage. Inspired by the book, they have written some truly fabulous character descriptions, bringing the dragons and their riders to life through their use of powerful vocabulary and imagery. We've also been working on writing exciting ending paragraphs, using suspense and emotion to round off our stories beautifully.

In history, our topic has taken us back in time to the fascinating Shang Dynasty. We've been learning about the social hierarchy of ancient China and comparing it to another great civilisation we know well — the Roman Empire. The children have impressed us with their ability to make thoughtful comparisons and understand how different societies were organised and ruled.

Science has been truly 'out of this world' this term as we've explored the topic of space! We've learned all about the planets in our solar system, the moon and its phases, and how the rotation of the Earth creates daytime and night-time. The children have enjoyed sharing their knowledge and asking brilliant questions about the wonders of space.

A real highlight of the term was our exciting trip to Thorpe Park for a science themed excursion. The children learned about the many different careers that involve science, from engineering to design and how scientific knowledge is used in the real world. Of course, we also had time for some fun on the rides, and it was wonderful to see so many smiling faces!

It's been a busy, rewarding, and inspiring start to the school year. We are so proud of how much the children have achieved already, and we can't wait to see what amazing things the next term will bring!

YEAR 6 THIS TERM

In both Reading and Writing, we have been immersing ourselves in the thought-provoking novel, Can You See Me? by Libby Scott and Rebecca Westcott. As we follow Tally's journey, we've been strengthening our skills in interpreting vocabulary through context, identifying key information, and drawing insightful inferences about the deeper messages within the text. During Writing, our work has also been inspired by Can You See Me? We began by crafting diary entries from Tally's point of view, exploring her everyday joys and the challenges she faces as an autistic girl. This led to persuasive writing pieces, where we championed the importance of inclusion within schools. At the sentence level, we've been focusing on mastering techniques with simple sentences in order to create paragraphs which are grammatically correct. More recently, we embraced the 500-word challenge; an opportunity to write freely on any topic, unleashing our creativity and showcasing our unique voices as writers.

At the start of the term, we were visited by staff from Cranford Community College, who shared valuable insights about transitioning to secondary school. We then spoke to the children about the importance of attending open evenings to support their secondary school choices and applications.

Wednesdays have been filled with rhythm and energy thanks to our Samba drumming sessions with Hillingdon Music Service. The children have had the chance to play a variety of percussion instruments including caixas, surdos, ganzas, tamborims, and go-go bells, building teamwork and musical skills in a fun and lively way.

Looking ahead, we're eagerly anticipating two exciting experiences: our November BEE workshop with Heathrow next month and our December visit to the National Portrait Gallery. Both events promise to be inspiring and unforgettable, and we can't wait to see the creativity they spark in our future projects!









AUTUMN TERM 1 2025

In Tajiri, children have been learning about their different senses. They have explored a range of sensory experiences and learnt key words such as "hot", "cold", "wet" and "dry" to help communicate their sensory preferences. They have been learning initial letter sounds and have begun using oral blending to find object names. Children have been exploring number and representing the numbers 1-4 in a variety of ways and using sensory exploration to develop their fine motor skills and number formation. They have also been identifying people who are important to them, such as key staff and family members, and finding photos of these people through the "who" colourful semantics visual. Tajiri have really enjoyed their music lessons this half term and have been experimenting with the recorder.























THUNBERG

In Thunberg, children have been exploring the topic "growing". They have grown their own sunflowers and cress and learnt about what plants need to grow. They have conducted an experiment on the differences between plants grown in darkness and in light and have enjoyed watering their plants each day. They have also learnt about how humans grow from babies to adults and how to keep themselves healthy to grow strong! They have explored a range of key stories relating to growth such as "The Very Hungry Caterpillar" and "The Enormous Turnip" and have begun to describe what is happening in these stories using "who" and "doing" colourful semantics.


