OUR CURRICULUM

We have planned a challenging, engaging and exciting curriculum again for this half term. It will enable our pupils to continue to master the core skills and embed knowledge whilst exploring new themes and topics. Our Five Guiding Powers continue to underpin every aspect of our learning.

We will continue to develop our arithmetic and reasoning skills using 'Power Maths'. Talk 4 Writing will continue to form the basis of our Writing lessons. Reading skills will be developed through our whole class reading approach.

Our Science and non-core subjects (History, Geography etc) will be taught through our new Cornerstone Curriculum Projects. The Cornerstones Curriculum is a creative and thematic approach to learning that is mapped to ensure comprehensive coverage of national expectations. Our new curriculum will be delivered through Imaginative Learning Projects (ILPs) and Knowledge Rich Projects (KRPs) which will provide a rich menu of exciting, motivating and outstanding learning activities that make creative links between all aspects of your child's learning Homework will be given out every Friday and needs to be returned by the following Wednesday. Your child's homework will be linked to what they have learned in class or will be learning in the coming week. This includes English, Maths , Phonics and home reading books.
