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IMPORTANT INFORMATION REGARDING IMMUNISATIONS FOR CHILDREN/YOUNG PEOPLE

MMR IMMUNISATIONS

Dear Parent/Guardian,

We have seen an increase in Measles cases in our boroughs and across the UK. Measles spreads easily and can cause serious illnesses, including Pneumonia and Meningitis.

We would like to check your child has been vaccinated with both doses of MMR to ensure they are fully protected.

The first dose of MMR is given at the age of 12 months and the second dose of MMR is given at around 3 years and 4 months, before starting Reception class. Having both doses gives long lasting protection against Measles for many years, and millions of doses have been administered in the UK.

The vaccine has been thoroughly tested and is the safest and most effective way to protect your child against the disease. You can find more information about the **MMR** vaccination here:

Please be aware that if required there is a gelatine free MMR vaccine available.

To be sure that your child is up to date with all their routine vaccinations, please check their Red Book (**personal child health record**). The **1**st **MMR** is usually recorded on page 21 – 1-year old immunisations, and the **2**nd **MMR** is usually recorded on page 22-preschool immunisations. You can also check with your GP.
