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Teachers' Notes

In this therapy, the focus is on modelling the use of key words to help pupils answer questions about a text.

It begins by modelling how to identify the key words in the question. Then it moves on to using these to locate the relevant information in the text.

Throughout the lesson, there are opportunities for pupils to practise these skills independently.

To help us to understand and answer questions about a text, it is important that we can pick out **key words**.

For example: what are the most important words to understand in this question?

What sort of food does a penguin eat?

What sort of **food** does a **penguin eat**?

The key words in this question are 'food' and 'penguin eat'. The other words link these together, but they wouldn't help me to answer the question.

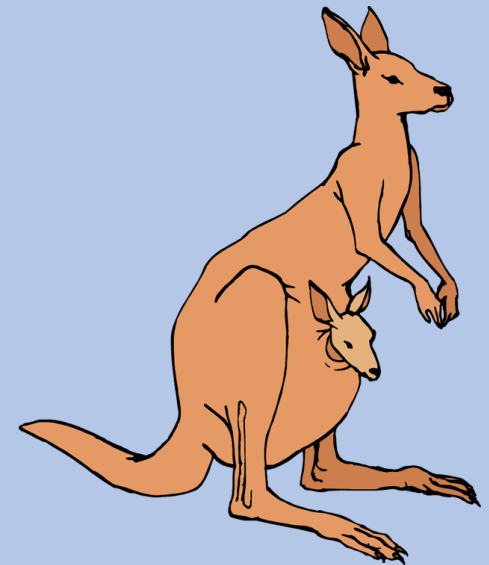

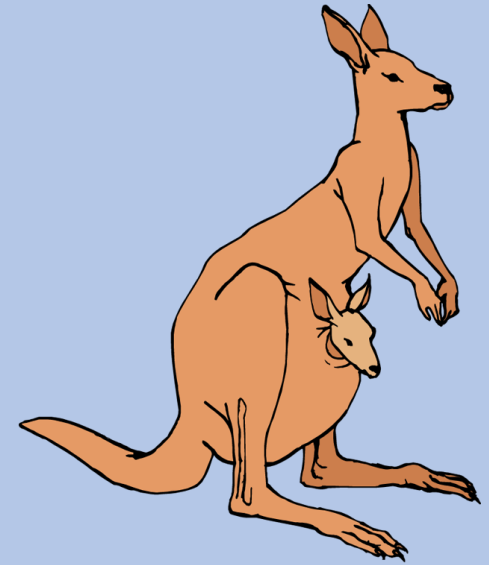

Why is it important to be able to identify key words?

If we can identify the key words in a question, we are more likely to be clear on what we are being asked. It will also help us to find the answer in the text.

Read this text then we will model how to find answers using key words.

Penguins are excellent swimmers. They have special flippers to help them swim. Penguins can swim up to speeds of 15 miles per hour. They can stay underwater for up to 20 minutes at a time. Penguins' black and white colouring gives them camouflage while they are swimming.

What **speed** can **penguins swim** at?

Penguins are excellent swimmers. They have special flippers to help them swim. Penguins can **swim** up to **speeds** of 15 miles per hour. They can stay underwater for up to 20 minutes at a time. Penguins' black and white colouring gives them camouflage while they are swimming.

Firstly, highlight the key words in the question.

Now I scan the text for my key words.

Once I find the key words, I will read the full sentence and, hopefully, find the answer.

So, the answer is: up to 15 miles per hour (we don't need a full sentence here).

Your turn: use key words to help you to answer these questions about the text.

Kangaroos are found in the wild in Australia. There are four different types of kangaroo. An interesting fact about kangaroos is they can't walk backwards! However, they can jump up to three times their own height. They can also swim.

Baby kangaroos are called 'joeys' and they are carried around in their mother's pouch. They usually live to the age of six years old.

How many types of kangaroo are there?

What are baby kangaroos called?

What age do kangaroos usually live to?

Your turn: use key words to help you to answer these questions about the text.

The T-Rex is known as the 'King of the Dinosaurs'. It was a vicious meat-eating creature. It weighed about 7.5 tons. It had huge, powerful back legs to carry its massive body. It also had a long, thick tail to help with balance.

Scientists think that the T-Rex probably didn't run. One reason is because of how big it was. Another is that, if it fell over, it probably wouldn't have been able to get back up again!

Write down two adjectives used to describe the legs of a T-Rex.

Why did it have a thick, long tail?

Which word tells us that the body was very big?

Your turn: use key words to help you to answer these questions about the text.

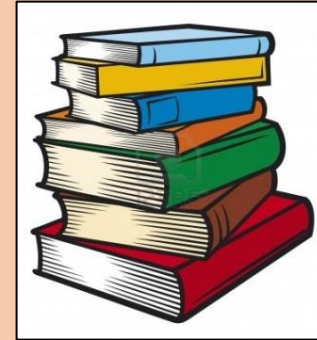

So, when you are trying to answer questions about a text, make sure you do the following:



- Read the text carefully first.
- Read the question carefully.
- Underline or highlight the key words in the question.
- Scan the text for these key words.
- Read the text around them.
- Find the answer.
- Always read the question again to check that you have answered it correctly.
